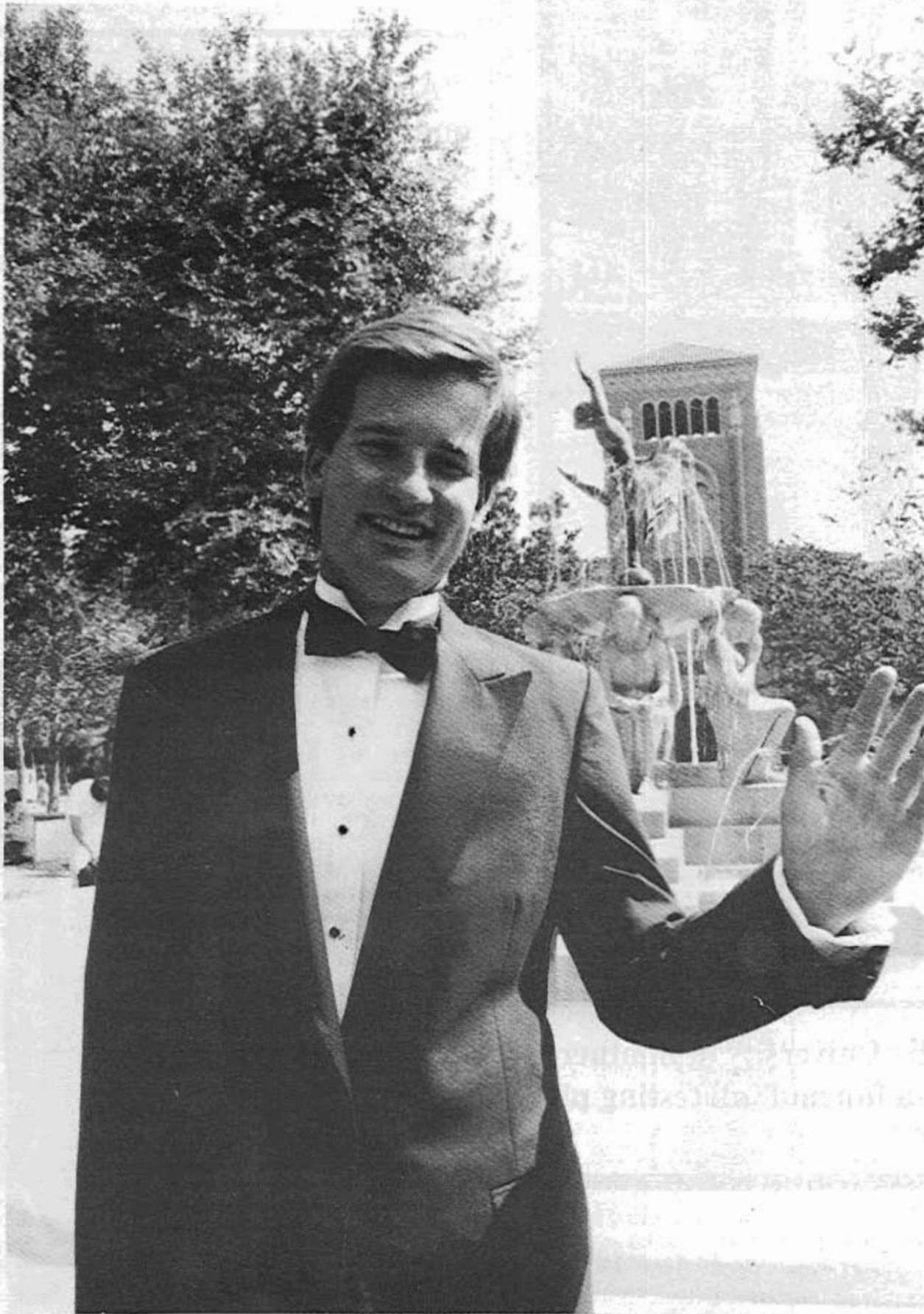

"University parking has always been a controversial subject. Not only does the SC student have to worry about finding a convenient parking spot..."

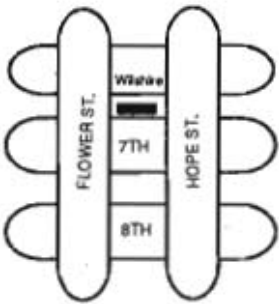
